Signs of hope for the nations Ruth chapter 1:22

1. Promise of new beginnings vs 22

In those days, Israel had no king, everyone did what was right in their own eyes. No or poor leadership have devasting consequences.

Elimek (God is king), Naomi (pleasantness) and their two children Mahlon (Sickly) and Kilion (to become weak and die) left Bethlehem because of famine to live in Moab, a foreign country.

Do not call me Naomi but Mara! To give up on your name, she must have felt low. One's name is so closely tied to your identity and personhood.

Vs 22.

However, she arrives there at the beginning of harvest. There is hope! Signs of restoration and newness. God has not forgotten us! For many around the world hopefully, there are signs of new beginnings.

2. Providence 2:3
